


Rapid Response Home Visiting

Trauma Implications & Considerations Learning Path

Throughout the Trauma Implications and Considerations Learning Path, family service professionals will learn information and strategies, and hear about other's professional experiences working with families who have experienced trauma.

Module & Webinar Descriptions





Webinar: Trauma & Its Manifestations

This webinar focuses on trauma and how trauma manifests in individuals. The discussion topics include psychological trauma, its impact on relationships, and the home visitor's role when working with individuals impacted by trauma.



2. Webinar: Working with Adults Impacted by Trauma

This webinar is the second part of a series on Trauma. Learners will focus on the core sensitivities and intervention goals while providing techniques for working with adults impacted by trauma.



3. Webinar: Responding to Developmental Disorganization

This webinar describes how regression differs from a developmental delay and what may be typical regressions in times of stress. Listeners will gain ways to use developmental regressions as an opportunity to join with families during these moments of vulnerability and build on their resilience.



4. Webinar: Self-Care: Strategies to Regulate & Recharge in Times of Stress

This webinar describes self-care practice through the lens of Protective Factors. Learners will gather strategies they can implement to regulate stressors and recharge.

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
